While we do not expect our leaders to be perfect, we do expect them to be a model for other Christians to follow (e.g. 1 Cor. 4:16-17; 1 Thess. 1:6-7).

Small Group Leader Role & Responsibilities

At New Story, we see the Small Group leader as the pastor of their group. At its core, pastoring is "nurturing a culture of Christoformity." A culture is comprised of the beliefs and behaviors characteristic of a group of people. So, in other words, as a Small Group leader, the goal is to create and nurture a culture within the group where people are learning to be with Jesus, become like him, and live like him. We refer to this process as spiritual formation. A simple definition of spiritual formation is "the process of being formed into the image of Christ for the sake of others." While there are many facets to spiritual formation, we believe that community is a non-negotiable element in the process. The purpose of Small Groups at New Story is to foster environments, or communities, where spiritual formation can take place.

Model of Formation:



So how can a Small Group leader do this effectively? Lead out of their own growth, their own spiritual formation. The most important work of a Small Group leader is taking their own spiritual formation seriously, living with great intention to abide in Christ. The only real metric to determine whether a group is healthy and growing is the posture of the leader toward their own growth. Minimally transformed leaders will always produce minimally transformed people doing minimally transforming ministry.

Beyond tending to your own spiritual formation, here are seven key responsibilities we believe will keep you and your Small Group on track:

- 1. **Focus on Jesus.** Small Groups aren't community for the sake of community. The purpose of Small Groups is life transformation through encounter with the risen Jesus as we do life alongside others committed to following him.
- 2. **Create an environment.** We want Small Groups to be welcoming, warm, and safe spaces where people feel comfortable engaging in discussion and sharing about their struggles and wounds without being judged. Sharing a meal is always a good thing too!
- 3. **Facilitate participation**. Small Groups aren't just a Bible study or a social group. We want these to be environments where people learn about and practice spiritual disciplines together.
- 4. Care for the Group. The primary way that we can meet many needs for people in our church is through our Small Groups (e.g. prayer, meals, financial assistance, house or car issues, etc.). Additional support and resources are always available through our elders, pastors, and Care Team.
- 5. **Cultivate relationships.** Within Small Groups, relationships are central and key to life transformation. God transforms us through life-on-life relationships with others who are pursuing Christ.
- 6. **Coordinate serving.** We don't want our Small Groups to become "naval gazers," we want them to also be attentive to the needs of communities in which we live. Once a semester we want our Small Groups to serve together in our communities.
- 7. **Give away responsibility.** Look for opportunities to hand off leadership and responsibility, especially to potential future small group leaders. Specifically, we want you to identify someone who could be a co-leader and invest in that person(s) to a greater degree than the rest.



NEW STORY CORE DOCTRINES

- 1. The Bible is inspired by God and the final authority in faith and life.
- 2. There is one God who exists in three persons Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.
- 3. Jesus Christ is fully God and fully man.
- 4. All of humanity is spiritually lost and without hope apart from God's special intervention.
- 5. The only solution for our spiritually lost state is to be reconciled to God through Jesus Christ, whose death and bodily resurrection make a relationship with God possible.
- 6. This new relationship with God is a free gift, by grace, and it is offered to all who put their faith in Jesus Christ. It cannot be achieved by good works nor is it given according to race, status, or ability-salvation is through faith alone and by grace alone for all eternity.
- 7. Jesus Christ will physically return to judge both the living and the dead and to establish his kingdom forever.

Levels of Affirmation & Conviction

- In significant matters of interpretation & matters of church practice, agree to <u>submit to the position of</u> <u>the Elders</u> and not promote a contrary position. This would include issues like: the practice of sign gifts, male only eldership, definition of marriage, et al.
- In additional matters where there have been a variety of views held by equally sincere, orthodox Christian groups, <u>allow for a plurality of views</u>. This would include issues like: worship styles, specifics of end times, persistence of sign gifts in the church age, forms of baptism, et al.
